



Anglia Ruskin University was awarded university status in 1992. Today, with a student population of 31,000, we are one of the largest universities in the East of England, and a large provider of part-time education.

Our students are on courses leading to undergraduate and postgraduate degrees, as well as to a range of professional qualifications. In addition to being one of the most significant suppliers of nurses and teachers to the professions, we offer an ever expanding range of contemporary courses designed to meet the needs of the individual and the requirements of a knowledge-based economy.

Our main campuses at Cambridge and Chelmsford attract students not only from the East of England but in increasing numbers from mainland Europe and from further afield. In addition, our University has an extensive network of contacts with institutions throughout the world, delivering courses in countries as far removed as Malaysia and Trinidad.

- 25% of our activity is at postgraduate level and we award at least 50 PhDs across at least 10 disciplines each year.
- We educate an equal number of students off-site and on-site, through remote delivery partnerships at home and abroad, and distance learning.
- Anglia Ruskin at Cambridge and Anglia Ruskin at Chelmsford are known as magnets for overseas students and 20% of our UK campus-based students are from outside the EU.
- Every student may study entrepreneurship and 10% of our students choose self employment when they leave us.
- Every year, we help at least 2000 organisations with Knowledge Exchange in particular, through a range of on-campus business incubator facilities.
- We are recognised for successful innovation in the way in which services are provided and for imaginative new learning environments.
- We are champions of employer and community engagement.
- We readily attract talented staff and prepare everyone to achieve our goals through continuing staff development.

We offer relevant and practical degrees

Our courses are designed to be not only relevant to the needs of industry and the professions, but also engaging and stimulating with the emphasis on the acquisition of practical skills.

Our <u>Department of Vision and Hearing</u>
<u>Sciences</u> has a long-established
relationship with some of the UK's largest
retail opticians, including Specsavers,
Boots and Vision Express, providing our
students opportunities for work-based learning.



- Our <u>Lord Ashcroft International Business School</u> has developed a course with Barclays Bank Plc. On this course, which is also being offered more widely as a talent recruitment and staff development solution for other businesses, students are workbased, sponsored and salaried for all 3 years of their course.
- Our Biomedical Science and Applied Biomedical Science courses are both accredited by the <u>Institute of Biomedical Science</u>. Our Applied Biomedical Science degree also offers 1 year laboratory placements, funded by the Eastern Region Strategic Health Authority.
- Our MA Film and TV Production has established links with 4Rights, Channel 4 television's commercial arm and talks and seminars are provided by members of Channel 4's Commissioning and Business staff. Our students have the opportunity to pitch to 4Rights, Channel 4's commercial arm, and 4Rights may make development funds available to students whose work justifies investment.
- Our <u>Legal Practice Course</u> was the first in the country to receive <u>Skillsmark</u> accreditation and was awarded a Grade 1 the top award of 4 possible grades consolidating our reputation as a provider of top quality, work-based learning. Skillsmark was established by Skills for Justice, the Sector Skills Council which covers all employers, employees and volunteers working in the UK justice system, as part of its mission to link learning to reputable and valued qualifications.

We've over 30,000 students, and are one of the largest universities in the East of England

- We supply many of the region's teachers, nurses, midwives and social workers and are the largest provider of undergraduate courses in subjects allied to Medicine.
- We're the largest undergraduate provider in the subject area of Architecture, Building and Planning.
- We're the largest undergraduate provider for Mass Communication and Documentation.
- We're the largest provider of postgraduate taught courses in the subject area of Historical and Philosophical studies, and 2nd largest in the subject areas of Architecture, Building & Planning, and Languages.

We care about the environment and Fairtrade

- We were ranked 10th in the <u>Green League 2010</u> by <u>People & Planet</u>; a league table based on 11 environmental criteria, both policy and performance-related.
- Through our efforts to reduce our environmental impact we have achieved accreditation to ISO 14001, an internationally recognised standard.
- We've been awarded the <u>Carbon Trust Standard</u> for our efforts to reduce carbon emissions.
- We've had a <u>Fairtrade policy</u> since 2007 and aim to stock as many Fairtrade products as is feasible in our restaurants, bars, cafés and other outlets. We also hold events throughout the <u>Fairtrade Fortnight</u> each year.

We conduct world-leading research

In the Government's most recent <u>Research Assessment Exercise</u> (RAE) for Higher Education Institutes we were the top-rated modern university for Psychology, 2nd for English Language & Literature (including contributions from Communication, Film and Media) and 3rd for History.

- Rated 'world-leading': 8 of our areas of research Allied Health Professions & Studies; Art & Design; English Language & Literature; Geography & Environmental Studies; History; Music; Psychology and Social Work; Social Policy & Administration had a proportion of their work rated as 'world-leading'.
- More than 30% of our submissions were rated as 'internationally excellent' or 'world-leading'.

We've great facilities



We've invested over £81million in the last 5 years, with a further £124million planned over the next 5 years. Among our specialist study facilities we've:

• a forensic science laboratory, complete with scene of crime workshops;

- 4 <u>University Libraries</u> (including an extensive Digital Library in addition to our onsite print collections);
- a suite of multimedia sound and recording studios;
- a Human Energetics Sports Science Laboratory;
- a University Eye Clinic;
- simulated hospital wards and operating theatres;
- bespoke counselling rooms;
- the 266 seat Mumford Theatre;
- 2 art galleries;
- a mock courtroom, for our Law students;
- a Language Centre; and
- Multimedia Language Laboratories.

We look to provide our graduates with future/employability skills

Our <u>Employer Mentoring Scheme</u> is highly-regarded, and has Home Office recognition. The scheme has been designed to support 2nd year undergraduates in thinking about, and planning for, the transition from study to work. Each student is carefully matched with a mentor from their chosen career field, who volunteers time to provide skills-building, support and encouragement.

Our on-campus recruitment agency, the <u>Employment Bureau</u>, also support students in finding part-time work whilst studying, and full-time employment after graduation.
